Despite this most of our teams enjoyed success and there were some outstanding batting and bowling successes. I can't remember a recent season with so many "five fors" with the ball and fifties and hundreds with the bat. Well done to all of you who enjoyed those milestones. This season our Premier Men's and Women's squads benefitted greatly from visiting players from overseas, in particular from South Africa. Chad and Ryan in the Prem Men, and Caroline and Bernie in Prem Women's have really made their mark in both of our teams. Stuey Naden from the UK also contributed usefully throughout the season. ## Premier Mens Squad Report



Although there was always going to be some disappointment if the Premier Men were unable to successfully defend their two-day title this season, nevertheless the season has to be very much considered a successful one. Our form in the shorter forms of the game had been poor in recent years so this season's winning of the Metro T20 championship was a major boost. Furthermore, although we started poorly in the one-dayers, and out of contention early, the four successive victories in the final matches certainly showed our potential to do well in that competition next season.



Although OBC were eventually worthy winners of the two-day competition, our 4th placing was only 4 points off finishing second and highlighted the frustration of a couple of results that we couldn't quite get over the line, most notably our failure in the match just before Christmas to chase down 158 in the final innings against Lancaster Park on Sydenham.

Player performances were dominated by a couple of players in each discipline. Club Player of the year Ryan Wallace, together with Dylan Goldstone, scored that bulk of the runs with contributions from Chris Harris chipping in from the middle order, and Chad Bowes when away from Canterbury duties. Others showed some promising signs but not yet the consistency to be become that missing player who scores 500-600 runs in the season to complete a more dominating batting unit.

The bowling was similar with Mitch Gardner and Harry dominating the stats complemented by some useful contributions at times from others. Undoubtedly the team felt the early loss of Harshall Vyas to Auckland, and particularly Braden Gardner to injury in the second half of the season - we look forward to having Braden back fit and refreshed next season. The fielding tended to run either hot or cold, and although probably one of the better fielding teams that we've put out in recent years, the lack of fielding practice during the week was clearly obvious on a number of occasions - an easy fix for next season with some better organisation.

## Premier Women's Report

Our women's section continues to grow in strength. This season our premier team led by Ashley Cloake had a chance of making the 50 over final. It came down to beating the team we had been neck and neck with all season, OBC. Unfortunately things didn't go well on the day and we didn't quite get there.

The premier women's competition was make up of four teams this season: LPW-East Shirley, a 'super team' that on paper was set to dominate due to its large portion of rep players; OBC, a team very closely matched to Sydenham; and St Albans, a young team, weakened by the fact their three White Ferns were absent all season.

Our girls beat the 'super team' team near the start of the season and were never once embarrassed by them. We battled with OBC all season and dominated St Albans on the last day (bowled them out for 16 runs) to claim third in the 50 over series and third in the T20 series.





Our South African girls played a big part in our success. Carolyn Esterhuizen ripped through a large number wickets (33 in 16 matches) including a hat-trick against OBC and best figures of 7-2 against St Albans in the last game. Bernadine Bezuidenhout scored a large number of runs (537 in 14 innings) which included a century against LPW-ES and topped the overall T20 batting stats in the competition. Her strike rate over both forms of the game was a massive 117. Jenna Waghorn once again matched Carolyn with her number of wickets in the 50 over games. Jenna's best figures being 5-13.

We congratulate Carolyn for picking up the Metro Cricket's Women's Club Cricket Player of the Year

award, and Jenna for sharing the top bowling award with her. This is a huge achievement not only for them both but for our club.

We congratulate Eden Pettigrew on making her debut this season for the Canterbury Women's U21 team and Bernadine for making her mark on Women's Domestic Cricket with the Northern Spirit.

With the future in mind, Sydenham is in a great position for female cricket with a perfect pathway. We have had overflowing numbers in all three of our junior teams and our Div1 team who played T20s all season won their series! We also had a good number of girls playing in age group rep teams. ## The South African Connection

With rugby and cricket the national sports of both New Zealand and South Africa, Kiwi's and South Africans have been battling each other on sports fields for generations. And to be fair, whilst the All Black have had the wood on South African rugby for at least the last couple of decades, the Proteas have only rarely been troubled by the Black Caps. So in the spirit of the old saying "if you can't beat them, join them", in the past two years Sydenham have proven what a wonderful tactic that is by gaining the services of a quartet of excellent young South African cricketers.

**Chad Bowes** arrived last season and immediately impressed not only the Sydenham Club, but more importantly, the Canterbury selectors such that he became a full time Canterbury player this season. And what a wonderful season he has had striking three Plunket Shield centuries for Canterbury this season, and becoming a key player in them winning back that title again. Chad's involvement with Sydenham was obviously more limited this season but he still managed to score one century for us, and his innings in the T20 final at Hagley was instrumental in us winning that title. Chad returns home to marry Chloe in May at which point they will both return to Canterbury in the winter to take up permanent residency as Chad strives to further cement his Canterbury place and push on for higher honours.

One of Chad's other good deeds for Sydenham was returning this season with another Southern African

Ryan has been outstanding for the Prem team this season both with bat and ball and rightfully won the "Beckenham Footwear & Engravers Player of the Year and the Club Player of the Year - MVP points" at the annual prize giving. Ryan now heads back to play for Stockton CC in the UK in our off season, and will return to Sydenham in the summer.

**Bernadine Bezuidenhout** and **Carolyn Esterhuizen** also joined their two compatriots at Sydenham and both had been the major contributors to the Sydenham Prem Woman's team. In addition to their prowess on the cricket field, all four players are also genuinely nice people and a credit to their country - they have quickly fitted in and already made many friends within the club, a club that is very proud to have them as part of the Sydenham family.
