PRESIDENT'S REPORT

And just like that, our season is over. It seems only yesterday that we fronted up for the season's first game on a damp and cold Saturday all those months ago. I am writing this before our awards night, but all the stats are already in. By any comparison, it has been a very successful season. On an individual level, our honours board is full of fantastic achievements with seven 100 plus scores, many 60s-70s and 80s and nineties, and our bowlers with heaps of 5fers and even 6,7 and 8fers.

But it is the team successes which are impressive. In no particular order, we have our Sydenham Youth 1st XI now promoted to the Championship grade of 1st XI Cricket. This is a fantastic achievement, and we will now play weekly against the top school 1st XI teams in Christchurch. Our youth cricket group has come a long way, and our coaching staff have done an incredible job in developing the players and teams into formidable groups. We can all be very proud of their achievements at all levels of youth cricket, especially the 1st XI boys. Our Premier women wrapped up the 1-Day competition by beating archrivals Lancaster Park in the finals match and were unlucky to lose out in the T20 competition.

In the men's section, the Premier Men had one of their best seasons for many years, winning the T20 competition and coming 2nd in the 2-Day comp. The latter was especially commendable if you remember back to the first match of the season when the side was in a strong position but was desperately unlucky to have its match against East Shirley abandoned when high winds crashed a massive tree onto the ground on the second day.

Across the other grades, the Masters Cardinal team took out the Frampton Memorial shield, the Goats, were worthy winners of the Division 5 grade.



We are clearly benefiting from having the use of our magnificent Sydenham Indoor Centre. We have been in there since preseason, and there is no doubt that it has been a game-changer for us. To have reliable, scheduled trainings and coaching programs indoors and under lights is fantastic. I know it is a facility that we can use more and more throughout the year for group and specialist coaching programs under the able leadership of our Director of Cricket, Matt Bell. The club has overall management control of the Centre as part of all the facilities within the park, and we are also very pleased that others from within our community are making use of the facility. Certainly, other cricket clubs and their players have made big use of the facility, but it is also fantastic to see young football players, hockey players and other sports like softball and junior rugby using the facility on those cold wet nights throughout the winter. We fully intend to extend the availability of the Centre to other community activity groups throughout the year as well, as it is a facility that needs to be used.



All of this reminds me that we are a very big cricket club. There is always something going on. We have recently updated our live-streaming facilities on the park by implementing the NV Play system.

Its live streaming functionality is another level to that of our previous system, with one of its key features being its ability to access individual player data for further analysis as part of the player skills development that Matt Bell undertakes.

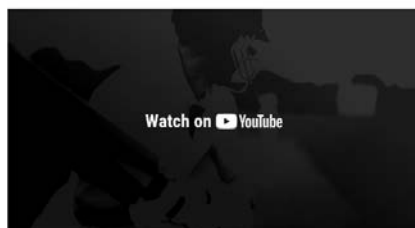

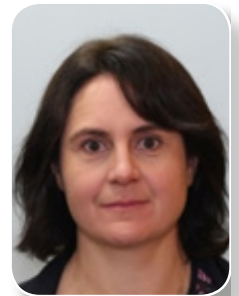

INDOOR CENTRE OFF TO A GREAT START

The club has been very pleased with the performance of our new indoor centre since its opening in July last year. After the first nine months of operation the centre is operating at a level comfortably above its general run costs and accumulating some reserves for the inevitable future repairs and maintenance that will be required as time passes.

The centre has been heavily used by the club for pre-season trainings throughout the winter prior to October by the men, women's and youth sections, and then during the summer whenever poor weather has stopped us from using the outdoor practice blocks. The Sydenham Juniors have also made extensive use of the facility throughout this period.

Individual club members have also been active in using the centre outside of their normal team practices, with pleasingly, many youth players especially dedicated to that additional practice. But players from other clubs have also been big users of the facility, increasingly so as many discover it for the first time.

The centre was always designed as a community facility so what has been most pleasing has been the number of other sports and community groups, in addition to cricket, that has been increasingly seen in the centre. Some of these include:

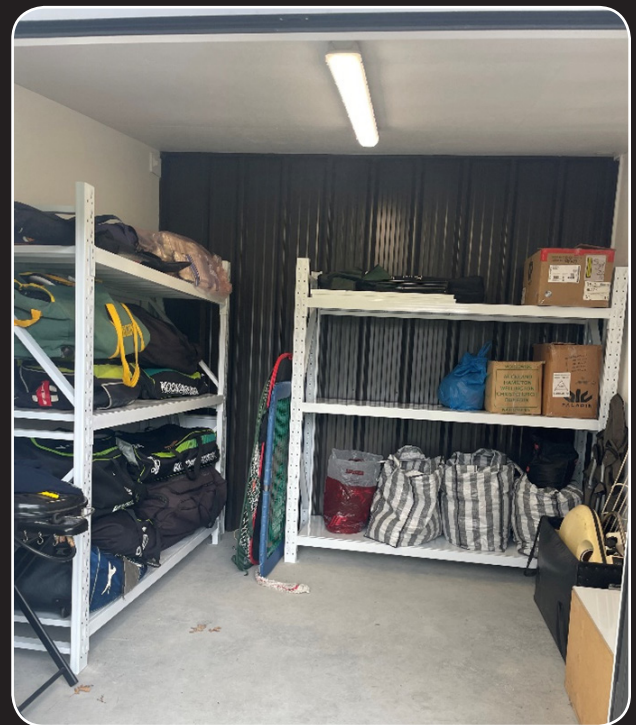


Australians Over 50s at practice

However, that is now resolved with an agreement with our neighbours, Southern United Hockey, to swap some new sheds at the back of the centre, which the club was planning to use, with the Indoor Centre storeroom (pictured) that the club had originally offered to Hockey.

2024 Youth season – halfway!

The youth section fielded seven teams in Term 1, up one from the end of 2023. We welcomed a strong cohort of Year 9 boys to the club and just had sufficient player numbers to enter two Year 9 teams.

Our 1st XI and 2nd XI both played in the Metro 1st XI Grade with the 1st XI playing in the Cup (2nd tier) and 2nd XI playing in the Bowl (3rd tier). The key objective of the season for the 1st XI was to finish in the top 4 of the Cup grade, which would secure their promotion to a ten team Championship grade in Term 4. With a lot of hard work from the players, Director of coaching Matthew Bell and coach Harsh Visavadiya, it is very pleasing to report that the boys fulfilled their objective and finished 3rd in the grade. The result means the Sydenham 1st XI will play in the 1st XI Championship Grade for the first time since the

Metro 1st XI grade was in its current format. This is a big deal and a huge achievement for everyone involved – well done!!



The 2nd XI endured a tough season but signed off with an excellent win in the final game of the season. The 2nd XI often struggled for consistent results and were a victim of individual success with top performers often being called in to fill in for the 1st XI due to injury, illness, or general player unavailability. The experience of playing in the Bowl grade will stand the 2nd XI in good stead for the one-day format that they will move to in the Spring.

As a club, it is very rewarding to see continued growth in player numbers above Year 10. Two years ago, the youth club fielded just one team of senior boys. For the first part of 2024, that had grown to four teams. There are a wide variety of reasons for the growth in senior youth player numbers. Obviously, the indoor centre and dedicated coaching facilities are big factors, but so too the different playing level and format opportunities a bigger club provides. Our 3rd and 4th XI teams both played in the Metro 2nd Grade competition, which is a 40-over format played on Saturday afternoon. This format is less time-consuming and has a more social environment than the 1st XI grades, and perfectly caters for those boys that love cricket but may not want to devote a full Saturday to their cricketing endeavours. The club fully supports offering a variety of different opportunities and formats for our cricketing youth.

The club also entered a team in the highly competitive Year 10 Colts grade. The team, comprising predominantly of last year's 9A team, had a slow start to their season but adjusted to the level of play, winning a series of games in the latter part of the season. Throughout the season every boy produced critically important performances with bat and/or ball. The key to better team results in the Spring will be more consistent and a higher number of top individual performances each week. The team certainly has the talent and commitment to finish right at the top of the grade. As noted earlier, we fielded two Year 9 teams. Our 9A team playing in the top grade won 5 of their 7 games and finished 3rd= in the grade for the

season. This was an excellent achievement and bodes well for ongoing player strength at the club. The 9B team won 2 of their 7 matches and finished 5th= in their grade. The team performed admirably given they were often short a player or three because of registration numbers totalling the bare minimum need for two teams of 22.

Overall, it was another positive season for the youth section of the club and the future looks bright.

Before I conclude, it would be remiss not to pass on an enormous thanks to all the volunteers and supporters that give up a lot of time to help deliver cricket for our youth boys. We simply could not provide the boys with the cricket opportunities they receive without your support. Thank you.
